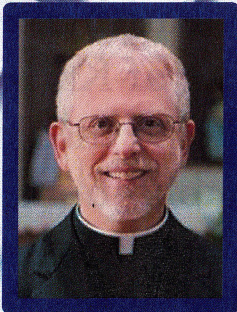

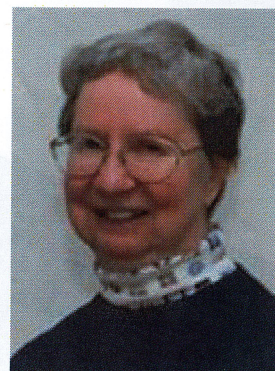

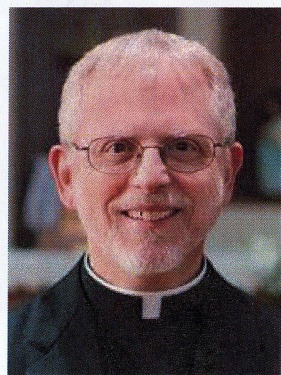


## Presenters

He is a former President of the North American Academy of Liturgy, a member of *Societas Liturgica* and the Catholic Academy of Liturgy. He is the 2013 recipient of the *Jubilare Deo* Award (National Association of Pastoral Musicians) and the Frederick McManus Award (Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions). He serves as a facilitator for the International Commission on English in the Liturgy.
